Push for system to verify environmental and animal welfare credentials

A major outcome of a recent ALMG symposium has been to ignite a push to establish a voluntary national system to verify environmental and animal welfare credentials.

Participants at the symposium, held in Brisbane in June, were unanimous in recognising that consumer interest in where and how their food is produced is a reason that a national voluntary environmental and animal welfare certification scheme must be the next step for Australian agriculture. The symposium brought together key policy makers, representatives of the food and fibre supply chain, specialist environmental and animal welfare interest groups, and landholders from across Victoria, NSW and Queensland.
